
Volunteer Appreciation and Recruitment



Roundabout Coming Soon

Thanks to the generous support from Georgia State Senator Elena Parent and officials in Dekalb County, we anticipate that construction for the long-awaited roundabout for the intersection of E Rock Springs, Cumberland Road, and Beech Valley should begin during the first week of February 2025.

E Rock Springs is a major thoroughfare in Morningside, that carries heavy east-west traffic during morning and evening rush hours. The intersection of Cumberland Road and E Rock Springs is particularly problematic because it is at the bottom of two steep hills, one from N Highland Avenue and the other from Briarcliff Road. There is not even a crosswalk at this busy and unsafe intersection. Pedestrians have no safe way to cross E Rock Springs to and from the Marta bus stop located there. Children who attend Morningside Elementary School and who live in Edmund Park do not have a safe way to walk to school.

There are numerous examples of unsafe incidents that resulted primarily from cars exceeding the posted speed limit. Over the recent past, there have numerous instances of neighbors' mailboxes being taken out by a speeding car (for some, this is a repeat occurrence), wheelies in the intersection, cars hitting trees, etc. Earlier this year, the local US Post Office worker was thrown from her vehicle when a speeding car struck her vehicle. The installation of the roundabout will not happen soon enough.



MARTA NextGen Bus Network

It was brought to our attention by a neighbor that MARTA is in the process of redesigning their bus network: NextGen_Bus_Network. There are residents in Morningside who ride the bus regularly, and equally important, there are those who do not live in our neighborhood but rely on a current route to get here for employment.

In 2018, MLPA worked with Virginia-Highland Civic Association to ensure that access to MARTA remained accessible to and through our neighborhood. One of our goals is to

continue that advocacy and representation. Accordingly, the Board sent <u>this letter</u> to MARTA officials asking for sustained station to station access (Midtown to Decatur) with no transfer. We also included <u>supporting documentation</u> from 2018.



Reminder: See Something, Say Something


Morningside Supper Club


